She is also the president of Birkbeck, University of London. Julie Etchingam is a newsreader and journalist. She has worked for outlets such as the BBC, Sky News, and currently works for ITV News. She was the first woman to be named the Royal Television Society Presenter of the Year in 2010, and was awarded the prize again in 2016.
