Professor Debora Price is Professor of Social Gerontology at The University of Manchester, where she is also Director MICRA, the Manchester Institute for Collaborative Research on Ageing. Professor Price read Law at Trinity Hall, Cambridge in the mid-1980s, and practised as a barrister for 15 years. Due to an interest and concern in pensioner poverty, Professor Price moved into academia. Her research centres on finance over the course of life, with focus on pensions and poverty, financial services for an ageing society and household money.

Fiona Phillips is a broadcaster, journalist and presenter, best known for presenting GMTV from 1997 to 2008. She has presented on a number of programmes such as *Loose Women*, and has received numerous awards for her work – most notably a nomination for the *Royal Society's Interview of the Year* 1996. Fiona has been a judge for the Pride of Britain Awards and for the Children of Courage Awards. She is an Ambassador for Age UK and has campaigned for charities that focus on cancer and Alzheimer's.
